SCAFFOLD INSPECTION (SSCI) TRAINING OVERVIEW

The SSCI (Scaffold Safety Control Inspection) training program is designed in accordance with Unit Standard 263205 (the official training format for scaffold inspectors). Our training officers are CETA accredited. The title of Unit Standard 263205 is:- *Inspect access scaffolding*.

This program is aimed at persons at management level, including safety officers, site agents, managers, etc. Successful candidates will receive certification to inspect an access scaffold (System Scaffolding i.e. Kwikstage) up to 60m high.

Prior learning assumed to be in place on entering into this training program is as follows:-

- 1) Delegates must be able to communicate – NQF level 3.
- 2) Delegates must be able to read and interpret drawings – NQF level 3.
- 3) Delegates must be competent in basic mathematics – NQF Level 3.
- 4) Delegates must be familiar with basic scaffold erection and product identification.

This program runs over 2 days and covers all relevant aspects of scaffold safety thoroughly. Both days cover mostly theory with a small practical component for drawing study. The entire inspection process is dealt with from foundations through to final hand over of a safe scaffold. Real site scenarios are discussed and analyzed.

- Module 6: Ties
- Module 7: Classification of Platforms
- Module 8: Scaffold Access

- Module 11: Safety Precautions and Safety Signs
- Module 12: Scaffold Inspection and Hand-over
- Module 13: Control of Scaffold Operations
- Module 14: Responsibility of the Scaffold User
- Module 15: Scaffold Drawings
- Module 16: Design Loading Calculations
- Module 17: Written Assessment

If a delegate is declared “not yet competent”, he/she will be notified and given the opportunity to acquire new “evidence” to show competency. This will be discussed with delegates further when attending the course.

Each delegate will receive a custom designed training manual to facilitate the training process – filled with drawings, diagrams, etc.
